WEEKLY REFLECTIONS ON THE READING

Jesus came to fulfill the law so that heaven could be opened to the righteous. Jesus' teachings are not primarily about the joys and easiness of the Christian life, but rather about the commandments that our loving Father gives to us for our freedom and good. He, who is perfect love, made us in love and sent his Son out of love to teach us what it means to partake in his life – both here and forever.

In the first reading, Sirach tells the people they can choose to follow the commandments, or not. But keeping the commandments will save them. In Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians, he writes of the greatness prepared for those who love God. In the Gospel from Matthew, Jesus teaches about the law. He says that he has come to fulfil the law, and that those who keep it will be called the *greatest in the kingdom of heaven*.

RULES FOR LENT

Good Friday is a mandatory day of **fasting** for Catholics within the age range of 18 through 59. The minimum requirements for fasting are as follows: One full meal is permitted. In addition to this, two smaller meals are permitted but these smaller meals should not add up to a full meal. Snacks between meals are **not** allowed. Water, coffee, and tea may be consumed throughout the day. People are free to engage in stricter forms of fasting if they choose. On the other hand, people may be excused from fasting for appropriate health reasons. Good Friday, as well as all Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence. This means abstaining from eating meat (seafood and eggs are permitted). This rule applies to Catholics of age 14 and over.




